Repitition: The story

contains a repeated refrain. Pause and let your child complete the sentences as they become more familiar with the story.

Timothy Pope, Timothy Pope

looks through his telescope.

He looks up at the sky and the moon up there.

He looks left.

He looks right.

He looks everywhere. And this is what he sees.

Alliteration: The story also includes lots of alliteration which is when words begin with the same sound (or phoneme) for example:

Jumping Jellyfish

Stumbling starfish

Can you think of other examples with your child using the story to help you?





The book also has examples of rhyming words such as:

Me/Tea

Scream/Ice Cream

Can you find any more rhyming words or make up your own?
