

**LOCATION:** Based on feedback from various different stakeholders, the preference for the location of the new Limetree Children's Home is a location close to the existing Limetree Court. Therefore, the suggested location for the new home is on the corner of Mitcham Road and Bellfield Avenue, a short distance from the existing Limetree Court building. What are your thoughts on this location?






**LAYOUT:** Based on extensive consultation with Children's Services and other key stakeholders, BDP have proposed the below layout for the new home. Please can you let us know your thoughts on the proposed layout and if there is anything else you feel needs including?

**BEDROOMS:** The home will be a single story building, which will have 5 bedrooms for children and 2 bedrooms for on call staff.


All of the bedrooms are on a single wing of the building, with a living room located in the same wing to allow children a space to socialise with each other and relax on an evening before going to sleep.


DAY SPACES / SUPPORT SPACES: A second wing of the building is made up of day rooms and support spaces. The larger communal rooms have been designed to accommodate 3 wheelchairs at a time. Additionally, larger doors and movable partitions have been included within some of the communal spaces to allow access for up to 3 bed bound children.





**MASSING OF THE BUILDING:** The diagram below shows how the children's home will look in comparison to the future housing which is to be developed next to the home. Please can you provide your thoughts on the below and how this is situated within the surrounding neighbourhood?





**THE GARDEN:** Based on feedback received from parents and other key stakeholders, it is understood that the garden is really important to the children and is enjoyed throughout the year.

BDP propose to include sensory and accessible play equipment within the garden. The garden will also include accessible planters for the children and a mix of sensory surface finishes and textures.

The spaces within the garden will be arranged around a cycle track, which can be seen on the next page.

The photos below give an idea of what may be included within the garden. Please can you let us know your thoughts on these proposals and if there is anything else you think needs to be included?










- Sensory Play equipment integrated within routes through the landscape.
- Accessible play equipment with a natural palette of materials and colours
- 3. Sensory garden with raised accessible planters
- 4. Mix of sensory surface finishes and textures integrated with sustainable land drainage and areas of planting.



**SITE PLAN:** The below shows how the home will sit within the land it is located on. The home will have its own driveway with an entrance and exit to allow for easy vehicular access and the driveway will include parking bays and an area for pick-up and set down spaces.

The home will have its own private and secure garden which is overlooked by the Children's Home and is situated away from the main roads. The garden will be arranged around a cycle track.
