
THE VERY HUNGRY CATERPILLAR by Eric Carle

The Very Hungry Caterpillar is a modern classic by Eric Carle. It tells the story of a caterpillar who eats and eats and eats before turning into a cocoon and then emerging as beautiful butterfly.


Make a fruit salad: The Very Hungry Caterpillar eats lots of different fruit. Encourage your child to try tasting any of the fruits which are new to them. You could make a fruit salad together adding more exotic and unusual fruit sch as kiwi or mango.

Days of the Week: The caterpillar eats different things on different days. Help your child to learn the days of the week in order. You could talk about the different things that you do on different days of the week





Life Cycles: Talk to your child about the live cycle of a butterfly – how it changes from an egg to a caterpillar, to a cocoon (or chrysalis) and then to a butterfly. Do they know of any other animals who have such an interesting life cycle? (such as a frog)
